The first meeting of the Chorley and District Cultural Forum was held on April 30th. Present were representatives from Chorley Historical and Archaeological Society, Chorley Heritage Centre Support Group, Lodge Artists, and the LFHHS Chorley Branch, along with David Tetlow (Chorley Council's Cultural Assets Manager) and the Forum's current Chair, Stuart Clewlow.

The aim of the Forum is to enhance communication and cooperation amongst cultural groups in Chorlev and district.
