The Friends of Lancashire Archives, of which I am Treasurer, are attempting to raise this to save this collection.

The Archive contains over a 1,000 documents which cover the period 1189 to 1947 and reflect the vast influence this important family had throughout Lancashire and beyond. The papers cover churches, heraldry, genealogy, turnpike roads canals, railways, mining, the Peterloo Massacre and much more.
