Chorley 's Heritage Centre

For several years, the Chorley Heritage Centre Group has worked with schools and UCLan students, mounted exhibitions, hosted a regional Community History Conference, recorded oral history, and collected and archived many items important to Chorley's heritage.

Recently, Chorley Council gave the Group the use of the upstairs area at the "other end" of Astley Hall farmhouse. Good progress so far, but the ultimate goal remains the establishment of a town centre Heritage Centre for Chorley.

The current exhibition, "The Development of Chorley", continues until May 31st. From June 13th the next exhibition will complement the Chorley schools' exhibition commemorating Chorley soldiers who died at Festubert.

Future exhibitions will feature different aspects of Chorley's heritage.

The Heritage Centre is open on Mondays and Wednesdays from 12 noon – 4.00 p.m., and on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays at the same times when the lower gallery is in use.
