What happened May Meeting Liverpool Cow Keepers Dave Joy

Why keep cows in Liverpool? We found out that it was to supply fresh milk to the city. The Joy family lived in the Dales in a long house, which were used to keep families and their cattle indoors. In Liverpool they would use an end terrace house and keep the cows at the back. The cows would be brought by rail to



Liverpool on Fridays and were fed with grain from the brewery, oil and linseed from oil making, straw and hay, and grazing if it could be found. By 1900 there were 500 properties used as cow houses in Liverpool.

Orlando Joy came to Liverpool in 1861 and the family had cows in Liverpool



till 1955. After that they simply sold milk bought from the big producers. They used horses and carts to deliver milk as Rupert the horse knew where to go and didn't need a driver. In 1969 the business finally closed for good.

FAMILYSEARCH

New digitised images for Europe and middle east 678,543,481 records

The digital image only collections can be viewed at FamilySearch in three points of access: The **catalog** includes a description of all microfilms and digital images in FamilySearch images. New images from field operations or digitized microfilms are added daily. Historical **records** include collections that have searchable name databases or some waypoints to help in browsing unindexed images. **Books** include digital copies of local histories and published genealogies from the FamilySearch Family History Library in Salt Lake City and other affiliate libraries. This includes many books that were previously preserved on microfilm.

THE GENEALOGIST launched over 150,000 new records which could reveal the shady side of your family tree!

FIND MY PAST

Over 64,000 additional 'open' records have been added to the **1939 Register** since the Register was launched.

Irish military records Discover your military ancestor in this index of over 1,500 records obtained through the Our Heroes website. Our Heroes provides photographs and biographical notes of the officers of Irish regiments as well as Irish officers of British regiments who were killed in action or who were mentioned for distinguished conduct between August 1914 and July 1916.

South Lancashire Regiment Prisoners Of War 1914-1918 Discover your South Lancashire Regiment ancestor in this index of over 2,800 prisoners of war from 1914 to 1918.

Worcestershire probate index 1600-1858 Over 11,000 additional records have been added to the Worcestershire probate index.
