From Lancashire Archives - North West Sound Archive

Lancashire Archives reports that work is progressing on the packing and documenting of the Sound Archive Collections at present housed at Clitheroe Castle, and being moved to Preston.

It is expected that the Sound Collections will arrive at Lancashire Archives in June, and it is hoped that some recordings will be available from July 1st.

Details of arrangements for accessing recordings are not yet available, but it seems that advance applications will be needed, and that there will be a charge for the service.

Irish Roman Catholic Records: The National Library of Ireland has announced that its entire collection of filmed Catholic parish registers will be made available on line (free) from July 8th onwards. Dating from the 1740s -1880s, they cover 1,091 parishes throughout Ireland, and consist primarily of baptism and marriage records. The digital images of the registers will be searchable by parish location only, and will not be transcribed or digitalised by the NLI. See: www.nli.ie
