Eclesiastical Court Records - Anna Watson



"The whole system of Ecclesiastical courts is the most unfathomable mystery. Their origin, their function, their procedure are equally obscure, and the only thing which repeated experience has made clear is that it will not work" Sir Lewis Dibdin, 1883 Quarterly Review.

The courts dealt with such things as fornication, pandering, sorcery, defamation and adultery, errant churchmen,

false testaments and contracts, lack of sacraments, usury simony, lechers, recusancy, non payment of tithes and many other crimes of a moral nature.

The court met about once a quarter and cases could take many months.



There were many stages such as Presentiments, Criterion, Articles of Libel, Dispositions, Interrogations, Responses and Final Decree.

Punishments could include excommunication or penance such as standing up in divine service and confessing what you did and paying a fine. To do penance privately cost 1 guinea instead of nine shillings.

VISIT TO PRONI by Judith Hilton

On a recent visit to Belfast Bernard and I were lucky enough to visit the Public Record Office of Northern Ireland (PRONI), a new purpose built building in the Titanic Quarter of the city. Having filled in application forms and sending them in an advance we duly turned up at reception where we produced photo ID and 10 year reader cards were efficiently made for us. Two minutes later we were in the Search Room and helpful staff showed us where to find the microfilmed church records we were looking for. I have never been able to find a birth or baptism record for my paternal great grandfather Benjamin Paterson, born in Co Armagh circa 1861, despite the fact that his parents were married and his siblings baptised at the

Presbyterian Church in Portadown. He still remains elusive and we checked other local churches without finding any trace of him. However, we had more luck with his father in law, Robert McKnight, after looking in the Townland Valuation Book for Portadown in 1838. Previously I had two Robert McKnights to choose from but have now eliminated one of them by using the original copy of this valuation record, which I was able to order up on one of the many terminals and peruse in the reading room. There is something very satisfying about seeing your ancestor's name in ink on original paper rather than on a computer screen.

If you have ancestors from Northern Ireland I can well recommend looking at the PRONI website as many records are available on line, including valuation records and revision books, digitised OS maps and will calendars with images of wills. Better still make the journey over there, it's a great city. The helpful PRONI staff made us very welcome and we will definitely be back. To top it all there is an excellent café too!.

Images of original civil registration records are also available at reasonable cost on the General Register Office Northern Ireland (GRONI) website.
