The Oxford Dictionary of Family Names in Britain and Ireland compiled by Patrick Hanks, Richard Coates, and Peter McClure: This huge new dictionary is the ultimate reference work on family names of the UK, covering English, Scottish, Welsh, Irish, Cornish, and immigrant surnames. Each entry contains lists of variant spellings of the name, an explanation of its origins, lists of early bearers, geographical distribution, and, where relevant, genealogical and bibliographical notes.
